"Steps Through Time"

I have been looking over the packet of information from the RSCDS Seattle Branch describing their Fort Worden 2000 workshop and ball, scheduled for **September 15, 16, and 17**. It looks like it's going to be even better than last year! Consider the opening description:

"Come join us at Fort Worden 2000, the RSCDS Seattle Branch's 26th annual weekend retreat/workshop, where we'll be exploring and celebrating the history of Scottish Country Dancing. What better way to start a new century than by looking back through the centuries and examining the traditions that underlie this dance form and its music? This year's classes, which are ALL elective, include English Country Dancing, Stepdancing, beginning and intermediate Cape Breton Stepdancing, and Shetland Isles dancing, as well as Scottish Country Dancing, with an emphasis on some of the earliest dances recorded and their evolution. We welcome dancers with at least one year of Scottish Country

Dancing experience. The music will also be carefully selected to be appropriate to the century and style of dance being taught."

The weekend starts with a ceilidh Friday night. Then, Saturday keeps you busy from 9am till 4pm with the workshops, dinner at 6pm and the Ball at 8. On Sunday, there is one last combined class.

Here's a sampling of the workshops:

- Quadrilles - the earliest of the Square Dances, brought to Scotland from Paris in 1816; includes skip change step, strathspey, as well as some fancy steps;
- Cape Breton Stepdancing: Jigs, Strathspeys, and Reels;
- Old Reels - energetic dances, the only indigenous dances of Scotland; dancers set for 8 bars, then reel; setting steps can be as simple or complicated as desired; attendees will learn two basic and two more challenging steps in strathspey and reel time;
- English Country Dancing, a precursor of
